Recycling village

RECYCLING is taking centre stage in Y Felinheli, as the village's recycling banks have been relocated.

Formerly hidden away in a small car park, the banks have now been re-sited to the car park of the Halfway House pub.

The step comes through co-operation between Gwynedd Council, Antur Waunfawr and the local watering hole, and has greatly increased the

accessibility and convenience of the green service.

Cllr Sian Gwenllian, who represents Felinheli on Gwynedd Council, said: "More and more residents want to do their bit for the environment by recycling and composting as much as possible of their waste, and we are confident that this new location for the recycling banks will mean that even more Felinheli residents will make use of the facility."

Steffan Jones, Gwynedd Council's senior waste manager, added: "By allowing us to re-locate the banks to their car park, the Halfway House has done us a great deed, not only will this show people more ways to recycle, but the location makes it much easier for us to collect the materials."
